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New Risk Assessment

A new School Covid Risk Assessment has been completed in line with new Government guidelines for schools. Although we have been able to relax some things, including the 'bubble' strategy, hand washing and rules around infection control are still very much in force. Assemblies

We are delighted that assemblies can resume! We still need to make them as safe as possible, so the following control measures are in place:

- We need to ensure as much ventilation in the hall as possible (windows / doors open).
- Keep them short and sweet - 10 minutes in the hall is fine - if the assembly is longer, there is more risk of spreading germs.
- The good thing about assemblies being at the end of school is that any children who feel unwell, or who have had a message from home re. Covid, will have been sent home during the day.
- Staff need not feel obliged to stay in the hall, except for the Friday celebration assembly.
- Parents of children getting certificates on Friday to keep visitors to a maximum of 2 per child. Superstar certificates are kept to a maximum of 2 per class.

Nasal Flu Vaccinations – 11th October.

The Nasal Flu Vaccinations for all children will be carried out on the afternoon of Monday 11th October. **Consent forms are being sent out today and must be returned by Friday 17th September.** The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children, with potentially [serious complications](#), including bronchitis and pneumonia.
