What are the rules again?

It seems that the finer details of the rules around preventing the spread of COVID-19 are forever changing. I would absolutely urge everyone to follow the latest advice and adhere to the local rules. I would also encourage everyone to use their common sense. There will never be a rule which covers every eventuality and I find myself being asked all sorts of questions about what people can and cannot do. In general, over and above the rules for your area, the things to ask yourself are:

- **Am I about to touch something, or have I just touched something shared by other people?** If so I need to wash my hands properly or sanitise them. (Door handles, switches and keypads, trolleys, petrol pumps etc.)
- **Am I going indoors or into a confined space where people outside my household / bubble are present?** If so, I need to wear a face covering. (Including buildings, transport, even congested outdoor spaces etc.)
- **Am I in an area with other people outside my household / bubble?** If so, stay 2m / 6ft apart – give them space. (Sometimes this isn't possible and so either wear a face covering or move away.)

I would also reiterate the advice given some time ago, that just as important as all the above is the need to keep as healthy as possible through healthier eating and lots of fresh air and exercise. ☺

Nasal Flu Vaccinations – 18th Nov.


The Nasal Flu Vaccinations for all children will be carried out on the morning of Wednesday 18th November. Consent forms will be sent out beforehand. The children's flu vaccine is offered as a yearly nasal spray to young children to help protect them against flu. Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children, with potentially [serious complications](#), including bronchitis and pneumonia. However, the vaccination not only protects the child, more importantly it helps stop the spread of the illness especially to those older members of the family such as grandparents. It can cause severe illness and even death among vulnerable groups including older people, pregnant women and people with an underlying health condition.
