


Limiting Numbers in School – Rationale

I sent a text out earlier in the week explaining that the number of children in school is quite high. We are running at 70+ children in each day. The Government has made it quite clear that, wherever possible, people should stay at home – and that includes children. This advice is due largely to the new strain of Coronavirus, which is much more easily spread.

There are some children in school either because their parents are Critical Workers and are not able to look after them at home or because we have invited them in because they have particular needs. These children are most welcome.

The more children we have in school, the more difficult it is to maintain the level of social distancing that is required. Also, when we have a positive case of COVID-19 in school, the more families it will touch. Every member of staff here at Stubbins has their own family to consider. We must work together to limit the spread of this dreadful disease and the death that it can potentially cause. We are doing everything we can to make school as safe as possible, but it remains the case that your child is safer at home.
